



Announcement of Suk Samran Rural Police Station
Regarding the Anti-Bribery Policy for the Fiscal Year 2024

In accordance with the Act to Amend the Constitution on Preventing and Suppressing Corruption, B.E. 2561 (2018), Section 128, Paragraph One, it is prohibited for any state official to receive property or any other benefits that can be monetarily valued from anyone, other than the property or benefits that should be legally obtained according to laws, rules, or regulations issued under legal provisions, except for the reception of property or any other benefits ethically, following the criteria and amount specified by the National Anti-Corruption Commission (NACC). Following also the Code of Ethics for the Police Officers, B.E. 2564 (2021), Item 2(2), which emphasizes honesty, integrity, law-abiding, transparency in duties, not displaying behaviors indicating improper benefit-seeking, responsibility towards duty, human rights, being open to inspection and accountable. It highlights good conscience towards society, and Item 2(4), prioritizing public benefits over personal interests, public spirit collaboration, cooperation, and sacrifices for the common good, creating benefits and happiness for society. Coupled with the (Revised) Plan for National Reform in Preventing and Suppressing Corruption and Misconduct, which specifies important reform activities. Activity 4: Develop a transparent Thai bureaucratic system without conflicts of interest. Objective 1, Item 1.1, mandates every government agency to declare as an organization where all government officials are prohibited from accepting gifts and favours related to their official duties. (No Gift Policy)

Therefore, to prevent conflicts between personal and public interests, the acceptance of bribes, gifts, favours, or any benefits that could affect duty performance is hereby set forth in the practice guidelines in the Anti-Bribery Policy and the No Gift Policy from official duties, details as follows:

Item 1 This announcement defines

"supervisors" as individuals with the authority and duty to command, supervise, monitor, and inspect police officers under their supervision.

"Bribe" means property or any other benefits given to a person to induce that individual to act or refrain from acting in any way.

"Duty performance" means the actions or the performance of duties by government officials in positions that they have been appointed to, or have been assigned to perform certain duties, or to act as deputies in certain duties. This encompasses both general and specific acting within the jurisdiction and authority defined by law for police officers, according to the powers and duties specified by law.

"Gifts, gratuities, or any other benefits that affect the performance of duties" means money, property, services, or other benefits of value, including tips, received by state officials beyond their normal salaries, income, benefits from public service, which influence their decision-making, approvals, permissions, or any other actions in performing their duties in a manner that corruptly benefits the giver, whether in the past, at the time of receipt, or in the future.

Item 2: Police officers at all levels shall act as follows:

1. Do not solicit, give, or receive bribes, gifts, rewards, or any other benefits from performing duties.

2. Do not consent or knowingly allow family members to give or receive bribes, gifts, rewards, or any other benefits with anyone related to the performance of duties.

3. Duty performance must adhere to law enforcement impartially, prioritizing the benefits and image of the police. No actions that conflict between personal interests and public interests should be taken, such as accepting gifts or benefits that affect the performance of duties, using state resources for personal gain, disclosing internal information, or misusing official time for personal work.

4. Reduce the giving or receiving of property or any benefits ethically, according to the standards and amounts set by the NACC, by expressing through signing greeting cards, condolence books, or using social media instead of giving physical items.

5. Do not tolerate, endure, or ignore behaviors of accepting bribes, gifts, rewards, or any other benefits from performing duties. If violations are found, inform the supervisor/head of the station promptly.

Item 3: Commanders have the authority and duty to supervise, monitor, and inspect police officers under their jurisdiction to act in accordance with this announcement. In case of any violation, report to the supervisor/head of the station promptly.

Item 4: Anyone who finds violations against this announcement can directly complain/report to the Director of the Sukhsamran Police Station or via telephone number 089-8944561. The information of the complainant/informant will be strictly confidential and kept secret.

Item 5: In case a complaint/report is received, the personnel in charge at the police station will investigate the facts. If a violation is found, the perpetrator will be strictly penalized according to relevant laws, regulations, and rules.
